THE HOLOCAUST

Imagine you're a young Jewish child on your family farm. You play with siblings, laughing and having fun. The sun is shining and birds chirp in the clear, big blue sky. Then you stop because you see the Nazis (Germans) tanks roll onto your street. Tons of Jews are being forced to march with the Germans, walking to their own deadly fate. As you are forced to march you notice your old friends. Polish kids laughed at you and everyone hated your kind. You don't want people to see the tears in your eyes so you look down to your arm. Seeing the blue armband with a star reminds you that you are Jewish and that's why people hate you. Reminding yourself you don't care about them, you try so hard to have pride in your beliefs, but fail. You walk all over the place with little belongings left with you to the center of your town..... the ghetto.

Fourth graders are reading *Number the Stars*. I read the book myself and you are very lucky to read this. If you do not know what it is about you are in luck! Now this isn't a spoiler, but I will give you a little background of the book. The story is centered around Annemarie, who has a Jewish friend Ellen during World War II. Ellen's parents have to go away and Annemarie's family helps Ellen. Annemarie tries to help them but when something is left behind it will either break or make the effort to help.

Have you heard of Adolf Hitler? Well he hated Jewish people. Why you might ask? The answer is hard to understand. Jews had different beliefs than Hitler in things like their religion and looked different. Certain people like Hitler were Anti-Semetic. That's when people have a prejudice or discrimination against the Jews. So when Hitler came to power in Germany, he blamed the Jews for all of Germany's problems! The Holocaust began around 1941 and lasted until 1945. Not so long, right? But those years, were like centuries to these Jews. At first it wasn't so bad but then Hitler got people to hate the Jewish people even more. People who were friends with Jews either turned on them or stopped associating with them altogether. People who befriended Jews were looked at as traitors. Not only did people treat them poorly, but the food disappeared as well. Hitler and the Germans began rationing everyday necessities such as milk, butter, cheese, cream, sugar. The foods they survived on were gone.

As things got worse, the Nazis would be everywhere. Sometimes if you were Jewish you would be stopped and asked questions. Then the ghettos came, oh how horrible those ghettos were! You and your family would be "relocated" as they called it to a ghetto. Ghettos were little parts of the town, with barbed wire to keep the Jews inside. Some had shards of glass at the top and bottom to prevent escapes. You and your family would share a small apartment or home with several other Jewish families. The ghettos were dirty and had almost no food. The people in the ghetto (and this isn't to laugh about) had little or no clothes during all seasons with no heat and basically no blankets. Even worse, later Jews wore jail uniforms. If you lived there and went to a line for food sometimes you would pass starving kids whose parents died. They would be pleading for help, sick and starving but you couldn't help. So many people died from starvation.

There was also the lists which had Jewish families on them that Germans would get from synagogues. If you were on that list you would be sent away to a labor camp. Those camps were horrible because all day you worked with very little food in your stomach. The Nazis eventually attempted to eliminate the Jewish race. These camps became known as "extermination camps" or "concentration camps." These camps were the saddest and most horrible places in existence during the war.

Some Jews fought back and those brave people were called resistance fighters. They would blow up Nazis cars, trains, and get rid of their supplies. These brave warriors risked their lives doing this. If you were caught you could get killed, but most of the time the Nazis used you in their camps. If you got caught the Nazi's would try and get any information about your group. They would force the information out of you. Many countries entered the war, including the United States to eventually end the madness.

The Holocaust ended on May 8, 1945. The Nazi's surrended, not before Hitler took his own life. The Jewish population was devastated. The people who survived this war have had many stories to tell and things that scarred their lives never forgetting the things they saw. More than six million Jewish died and more people died too while fighting the Germans and others. We should remember this war, the people who





Are you the kind of kid who uses 5 straws for only one carton of milk? Do you do this trying to be cool or just to waste plastic? Well, either way, you are not only hurting marine life, but all living things. There is an estimate of 7.5 million plastic straws polluting our beautiful shores right now and out of all the plastic in our environment, 18 billion pounds are in the oceans. Annually, millions of sea life are killed each year mostly because of the consumption of plastic. Marine life rescuers rescue many fish and sea birds each day that had tried to ingest some form of plastic. We can start limiting plastic by decreasing our use of plastic straws.

In my opinion, schools should not distribute plastic straws. This is because every day, kids use straws for milk cartons and Poland Springs water bottles. Therefore the straws are wasted and later end up in the ocean. Our school goes through about 100 plastic straws a day, 500 a week, 3,000 a month, and 18,000 a year. The whole school district uses about 118,000 plastic straws in just one school year. The cafeteria workers should start putting out paper straws before it is too late!

Our plastic straws are awful for our marine life and you! Since many plastic straws contain BPA, they are scientifically proven to lead to heart problems, changes to the brain, behavior changes, and can increase your risk of cancer.

Fortunately, there are many existing alternatives to plastic straws. One of the many plastic straw alternatives are metal straws. Metal straws are not on the pricey side of the market. You would be getting a bang for your buck because you wouldn't need very many because they are reusable, versus plastic straws which you need a new one for every drink. Another alternative to plastic straws is hard plastic straws. A hard plastic straw is just like a metal straw and still reusable just made out of a different material. They are also very affordable, just like the metal straws. Both of these can be washed and reused!

THE ocean Needs us

Have you ever seen a stranded animal on a beach? Or have you ever wondered what goes into saving one? At the National Marine Life Center (NMLC) in Buzzards Bay they care for these sick and injured animals. The NMLC started in 1994 and has been helping seals and sea turtles heal and return to the ocean ever since!

I had the privilege of interviewing two wonderful interns when I visited! Kali Palmer and Kaitlyn Reed let me ask them some questions about their jobs. They told me that "the ocean needs us," and I agree.

Q: What are your names?

A: Kali Palmer and Kaitlyn Reed.

Q: How can I help a stranded animal?

A: The best thing you can do is call the experts and stay away from the animal. (The animal might not even be stranded.)

Q: What animals do you care for?

A: Seals and Sea Turtles.

Q: What is the largest animal you care for?

A: The largest animal we care for is a Gray Seal.

Q: Have you ever formed a special bond with a patient?

A: Yes, Kali loves Jones (seal), because he was one of the first seals she worked with! Kaitlyn formed a special bond with Mandrake the seal.

Q: How do you feed the patients here?

A: Seals get fed 3 times a day and the amount of food they get depends on their age and weight. Sea Turtles get fed twice a day and they eat squid and herring. Sea Turtles also grow faster here than in the wild.


Q: How do you name your animals?

A: We usually have a theme, for example Mandrake and Hagrid are part of the Harry Potter theme!

Q: Do you think keeping animals in captivity is right?

A: No, keeping animals in captivity is wrong so we always release the animals we help.

INSIDE LOOK: BOSTON CELTICS?

Have you ever wondered when the Boston Celtics originated, or some facts about them? Well, keep reading to find out!

The Boston Celtics originated on **June 6th**, **1946**. The Boston Celtics officially became a team in 1946 and were formed by Walter A. Brown. The Boston Celtics are based in Boston, Massachusetts. Their home ground is the TD Garden, which is shared with the hockey team, Boston Bruins. The Celtics are a member of the National Basketball Association. The Boston Celtics won 11 NBA championships from 1957-1969. Five years later, the Celtics won their 12th. And just two years after that, their 13th. Original team owner Walter Brown wanted a hook to try and get Boston's (at the time) large Irish population coming to home games and buying tickets. So, he hit upon the idea of using the very Irish "Celtics" as the name. Also, the team's mascot is called "Lucky the Leprechaun".

Below are a few Celtics players from the past that are important to their history:

Larry Bird - As a former Celtic he was described as one of the "greatest basketball players and greatest shooters of all time." He played 13 seasons [his entire career] as a Celtic. He was a 12 time NBA All-Star and received the NBA Most Valuable Player award 3 times in a row. He was also a member of the 1992 US Men's Olympic Basketball team called "The Dream Team." When he retired, he stayed active in the NBA as a head coach and other management positions for the Indiana Pacers.

Kevin McHale - He also played his entire career for the Celtics. He was considered one of the "best power forward" of all time. He was part of 3 NBA championships [1981,1984,1986.] After retirement he was a TV analyst, General Manager and Head Coach for the Minnesota Timberwolves. He was also a Head Coach for the Houston Rockets.

Danny Ainge - He played 14 seasons as a Celtic. He was an important piece of the Celtics team that won the NBA title games in 1984 and 1986. He also played for the Portland Trail Blazers, Phoenix Suns and the Sacramento Kings. But in the end he returned to the Celtics as their General Manager and President of Basketball Operations.

Even though the Celtics didn't go all the way through the NBA finals this year they had a great season. They were able to sweep the Indiana Pacers in the first round, which was the first time since 2011 they were able to sweep another team in finals. But sadly, they lost in the Semi-Finals. HISTORY OF FREETOWN

Dear Reader,

Have you ever thought you heard the screams coming from Freetown forest or learned about the history of Profile Rock? Do you know Freetown's history in and out, or do you just think you do? Reader...if you are questioning yourself right now, I advise you to read this brief history of Freetown, Massachusetts.

Geography - The town that is now known as Freetown was settled by English Pilgrims in 1654. Freetown stands as one of the oldest

communities in the United States! It was established in 1683. Made up of about 36.6 square miles, it has quite a peculiar geography. Covered in 1.7 square miles of water, the town has Fall Brook, the Assonet River, and Long Pond (which natives called Lake Apponequet). Water covers approximately 4.41% of the town.

Population - Freetown's population grew pretty fast over the years leading up to 1810. Once the 1810 census was taken, the population decreased until the early 1900s. This is when the population started climbing back up. Finally, the 1950 census showed that the population had evened out. There was then a great increase in residents in 1980. As of the 2017 census, Freetown had 9,339 people.

Local Native American History - In the 17th and 18th centuries, there were some Indian trails, each about fifty miles long, leading from Freetown all the way to Boston. Only a couple of the trails are still around today and are found in state parks. Most of the trails have overgrown with thick vegetation and others are now covered and used as state highways. Freetown also has many rock formations and forests. Profile Rock is said to have looked like Chief Massasoit from the local Wampanoag tribe. His "face" overlooks the old village of Assonet.

Freetown State Forest - Just outside of this granite rock is the Freetown State Forest. which can be referred to as the "mother" of Profile Rock. It takes up over 5,000 acres of Fall River, Freetown, Lakeville, and other surrounding municipalities. The state first started acquiring land for the forest in 1913. They purchased about 9 acres around Forge Pond from Levi Churchill of Berkley. Starting in 1930, the state bought many portions of land for the forest. This stretch of purchases ended after about 20 years, but since that time, a little land has been added every once in a while. Also, if you are walking in the Freetown State Forest, legend says don't walk alone, as it is said to be haunted with strange ghosts!

I hope that after reading this article, you don't have any questions. I also hope you learned a few things about the past and present-day Freetown.


